Senators Dick Durbin (D-IL) and Orrin Hatch (R-UT) have recently introduced the Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors Act (**DREAM**) (S. 1291). In the House, Representative Chris Cannon (R-UT), Howard Berman (D-CA) and Lucille Roybal-Allard (D-CA) have introduced the Student Adjustment Act (H.R. 1918).
