## University diploma Messages

Legislation in Congress would allow undocumented immigrant young people who were brought here as children, grew up in the United States, have good moral character and have graduated from high school, to become legal residents, go to college and work here legally.

Senators Dick Durbin (D-IL) and Orrin Hatch (R-UT) have recently introduced the Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors Act (DREAM) (S. 1291). In the House, Representative Chris Cannon (R-UT), Howard Berman (D-CA) and Lucille Roybal-Allard (D-CA) have introduced the Student Adjustment Act (H.R. 1918).

Attached is a University Diploma that can be completed by students, teachers, community leaders, parishioners, local elected officials, etc., urging their congressional representatives to support the DREAM (S. 1291) and Student Adjustment (H.R. 1918) Acts.
